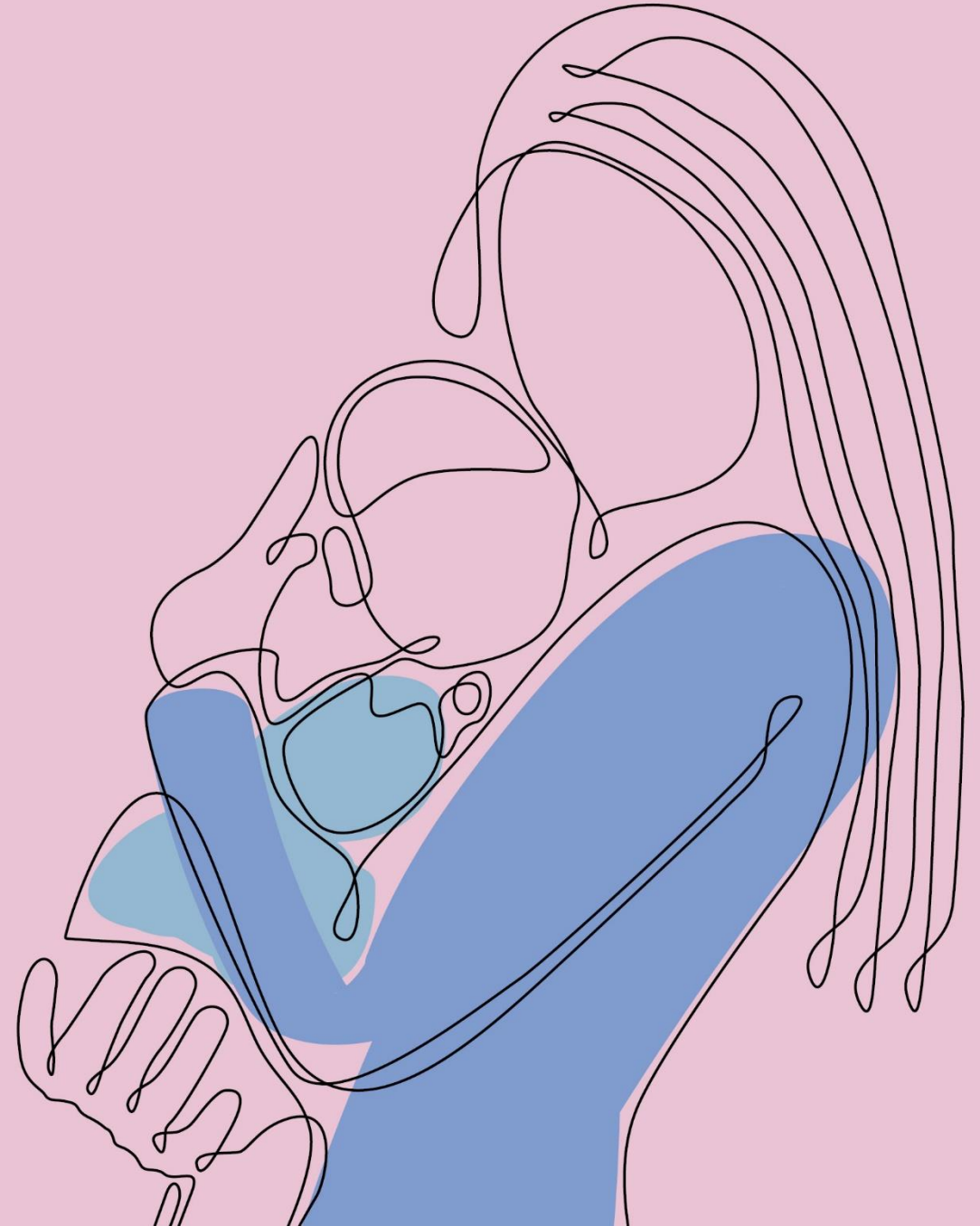
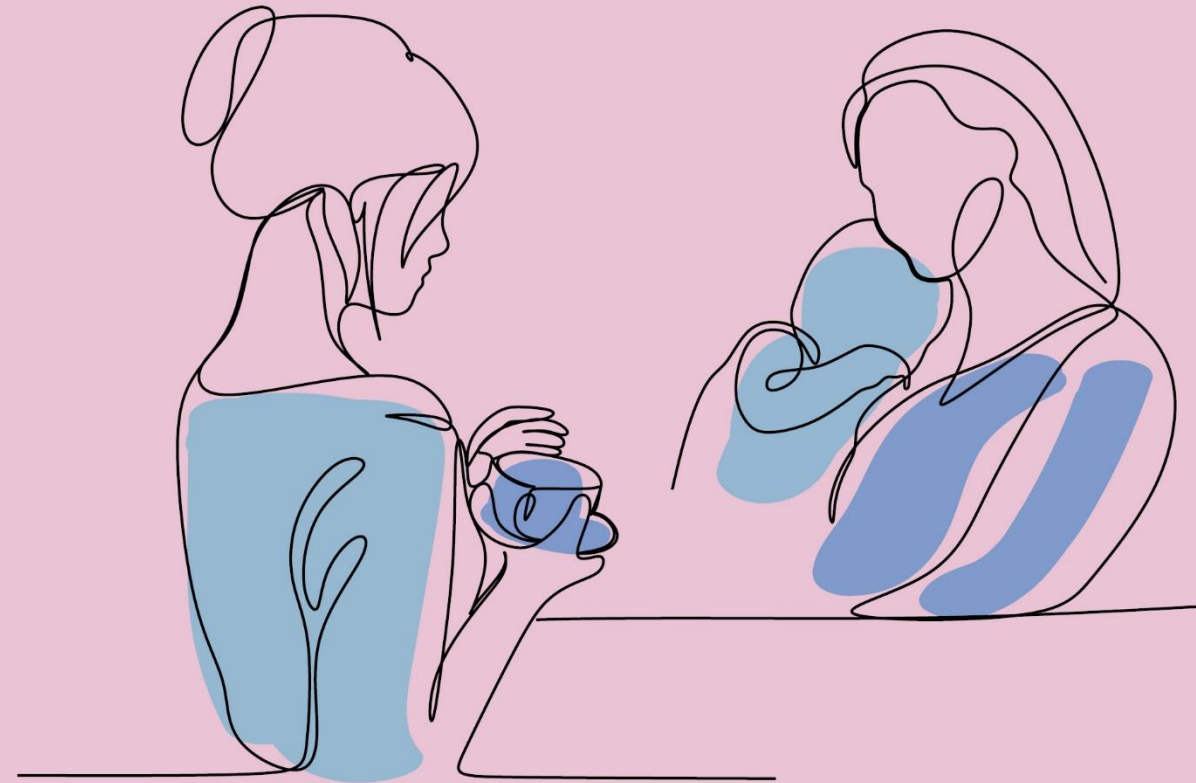

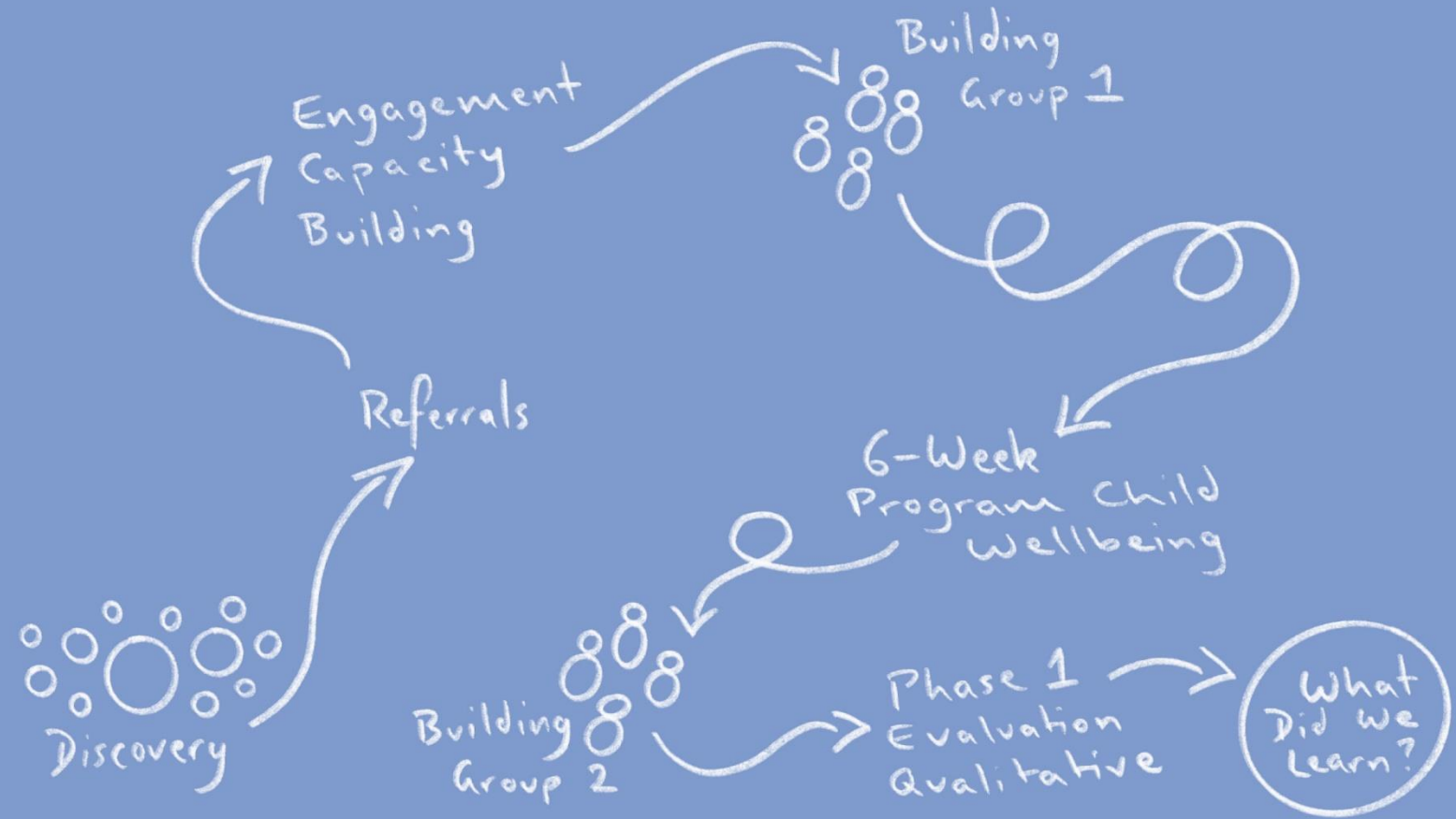


A New Way Of Keeping Families Together

"Often there is not enough focus on genuine relationship and trust building in other programs."

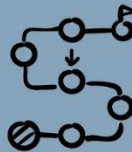

I think it's important just to have somebody there who's been through the same thing as you. You can talk to so easily about anything because that person is obviously been through exactly what you've been through"

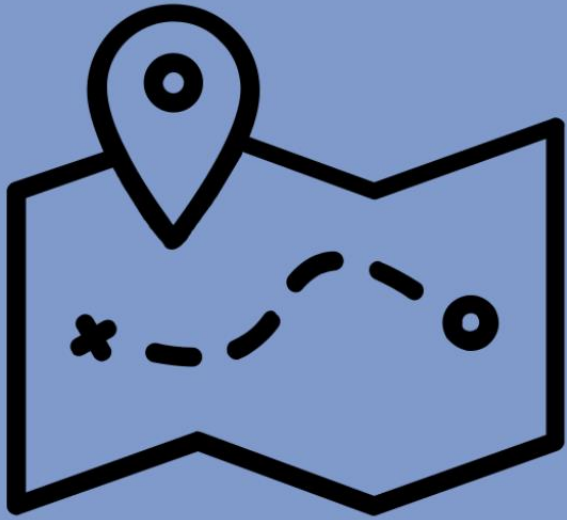
"I don't know...they've been young mums too so they get it, where other workers they just, they might not have kids, or they might be older, or they might look at you like you're a just young mum"
